




## **ABOUT US**

Care for Dogs Romania Association was founded in 2016 by Delia Botea, a young graduate of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science in Brasov. Since she undertook the mission of rescuing homeless animals, she helped more than 350 dogs and 40 cats out of which more than 150 found their forever homes.

Care For Dogs Romania has a solid team of volunteers who are constantly offering foster services and engage in dog socialization activities thus giving the dogs the best start for their future lives as indoor pets.

At the moment, the association takes care of approximately 200 dogs and 8 cats. Given the lack of proper stray animal management among the local authorities, the rampant cruelty toward animals and the increased abandonment rate, this number changes almost daily.

## **OUR MISSION**

Care For Dogs Romania's mission is rescuing and helping homeless animals in Romania by offering veterinary care such as life saving treatment, spaying and neutering, deworming, etc as well as finding responsible and loving families for them. Educational work is paramount to changing the precarious situation of Romanian homeless animals.

## **V**OLUNTEERS NEEDED

The only way we can cope with the huge workload required to care for the dogs in our care is to rely on volunteers. Volunteering offers multiple benefits for for dogs as well as for the people engaging in volunteer work.

### **O**PPORTUNITIES

### **DOG SOCIALIZATION**

Come to our shelter for a few hours and play with our puppies and adult dogs. This helps them get used to interacting with people in a way that makes them ready to become indoor pets. Walk them and teach them commands such as sit, stay, heel, down, etc.

#### SHELTER REPAIRS AND CLEANING

We constantly need help with dog pen repairs, yard cleaning, dog food preparation and serving, etc. The needs are endless.

#### TRANSPORTION

We need drivers who who are willing to transport sick animals to the vet in their personal vehicles. We also need volunteers to help us catch abandoned animals and transport them to our shelter.

### **HOMECHECKS**

We need volunteers willing to do homechecks with prospective adopters. We will provide training and will tell you what questions to ask and what to look for. Proper homechecking is extremely important in reducing the number of failed adoptions.

#### **PHOTOGRAPHY**

A great picture that highlights a pet's personality will increase the adoption chances for a dog.
